### **Principal Report 2021**

2021 was the 38<sup>th</sup> year since Christian Brothers College and Prendiville College amalgamated and continued to contribute to the 125 years of Catholic Education in Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

2021 was the second year of impact of the Covid19 Pandemic and continued to affect the normal operation of the school year. In Kalgoorlie-Boulder we were fortunate to avoid some of the lockdowns schools to the South and West of us encountered.

To the credit of the staff, core functions of teaching and learning continued, as well as many of the extra-curricular activities that are part of the weekly routines of the College.

Special thanks to staff for their commitment to their students and well done to our students who continued to ensure our hygiene and sanitary practices were diligently carried out.

Our School Improvement Plan, which gives us focus and direction for the most effective learning and community relations, was impacted by the Pandemic, primarily in terms of professional development of staff: large gatherings were not possible and Professional Development providers could not access the College in most cases.

Once again, staff stepped up to run internal P.D. and a key target area was refining Pandemic conditions.
